1 Cor 4: 6-13

Church of Corinth full of proud and braggadocios people:

- ❖ Proud of human wisdom
- ❖ Proud of human leaders

**1 Cor. 4:6** These illustrations teach philosophy of ministry

Must not pit one leader \_\_\_\_\_ another.

*I have in a figure ...* Used our names to save \_\_\_\_\_ of leaders in church.

*above that which is written,* You have exceeded what is written concerning how ought to \_\_\_\_\_ men.

Turned your respect into unhealthy worship and \_\_\_\_\_ of men.

Num 11. Moses held in high respect by people.

Eldad and Medad prophesied in camp

Mac: *Joshua's loyalty to Moses was misplaced. \_\_\_\_\_ loyalty, even to faithful men of God, inevitably brings hostility to others of God's servants. It causes envy, competition, and division.*

**Puffed up:** \_\_\_\_\_, blow; inflated view of self. arrogant.

**1 Cor. 4:7**

Barnes: *The whole passage is an instance of most pungent and cutting sarcasm and shows that there may be occasions when irony may be proper, though it should be rare.*

**1 Cor. 4:8** Paul heaps on feigned \_\_\_\_\_.

My, aren't you a great bunch of people?

You have spiritually \_\_\_\_\_, haven't you!?

Statement #1: ***Now ye are full***

You think you have all you \_\_\_\_\_.

**Full:** ...banquet...eaten until can't eat any more.

*We have \_\_\_\_\_!*

Ie. Church of \_\_\_\_\_ in Rev. 3:16-19

Statement #2: ***now ye are rich,***

In spiritual gifts and \_\_\_\_\_.

Statement #3: ***ye have reigned as kings without us:***

Martin: *They were acting as though the millennial kingdom had already begun and the Lord Jesus had already apportioned His rewards.*

***Without us:*** without any counsel, or teaching, or help from us apostles.

Attitude: get along without any help from \_\_\_\_\_.

Lenski: *They were silly people to act as though they had left Paul, Apollos, and Peter far behind, the very men from whom they had obtained everything they really had.*

Godly attitude:

Full vs I'm \_\_\_\_\_

**8... and I would to God ye did reign...**

I wish you were as fulfilled and happy and blessed of God as you think \_\_\_\_\_ to be.

**1 Cor. 4:9 Set forth:** Placed in public spectrum; \_\_\_\_\_ view

**Last:** of the \_\_\_\_\_ condition, the humblest state; similar to beasts.

***as it were appointed to death:*** as criminals condemned to \_\_\_\_\_.

Seneca: *This was perfect butchery, and those exposed to beasts in the morning were treated mercifully in comparison with these.*

How would you live if you were under the sentence of death?

What we are:

1. Spectacles

**Spectacle:** \_\_\_\_\_.

Barnes: *Paul represents himself as on this arena or stage, contending with foes, and destined to death. Around him and above him are an immense host of men and angels, looking on at the conflict and awaiting the issue. He is not alone or unobserved. He is made public; and the universe gazes on the struggle.*

*and to angels, and to men. They are \_\_\_\_\_.*

**1 Cor. 4:10**

2. Fools

**Fools:** morons, dull, \_\_\_\_\_, heedless, blockheads, absurd

There is something about gospel that always make us unpopular

**Wise:** thoughtful, discreet, \_\_\_\_\_

John Gill: *Their ministers took care to preach, and they to profess Christ, in such a manner as to retain the favour of the world, and to escape reproach and persecution.*

3. Weak. **We are weak, but ye are strong;**

**Weak:** more feeble, \_\_\_\_\_, sick, without strength

**Strong:** mighty, \_\_\_\_\_, powerful

4. Despised. .... **ye are honourable, but we are despised.**

**Honourable:** splendid, noble, \_\_\_\_\_, gorgeous

**Despised:** without honor, base, of \_\_\_\_\_ esteem

Sarcastic...full of irony.

Don't expect world to applaud you .

They look at you as someone who's really gone off deep end.

**Stedman:** *They had so accommodated, so compromised with the world around that the world was not persecuting them anymore. ... They had adjusted their teaching so that worldly wisdom penetrated everything they said and did, and the world thought it was great. They had adjusted their actions so that nobody was offended by them, and they never had to tell anybody that something was wrong. As we will see in the succeeding passages, the Corinthians accommodated to it all; they put up with anything in the church; they never told anybody they were doing wrong.*

**1 Cor. 4:11** *Even unto this present hour* As we \_\_\_\_\_.

**we both hunger, and thirst:** Paul potentially a wealthy man.

**and are naked:** No money or friends to replenish their \_\_\_\_\_.

Barnes: *Paul was not ashamed to travel, to preach, and to appear before princes and kings, in a soiled and worn-out garment, for it was worn out in the service of his Master, and Divine Providence has arranged the circumstances of his life.*

**Buffeted,** to be cuffed or struck with fists on body or face as slaves and criminals

**No certain dwellingplace;**

Lenski: *Without a fixed abode, shifting about constantly. Homeless. Often, the apostles were shunned by whole communities. Gentiles – didn't like them because of their Jewish character.*

**1 Cor. 4:12 Labour:** toil, work to point of \_\_\_\_\_.

Greeks considered beneath their dignity.

**1. Being Reviled, we bless**

**Reviled:** abused with words, reproached, publicly embarrassed, \_\_\_\_\_.

**Bless:** speak well of, thank or invoke a benediction, to \_\_\_\_\_.

*Trials don't make you...they \_\_\_\_\_ you. Matthew 5:44*

**2. Being persecuted, we suffer it.**

**Persecuted:** followed after, pressed, put to flight, driven away

**Suffer it:** patiently \_\_\_\_\_; don't try to retaliate or get revenge.

**Barnes:** *we abstain from resenting or resisting it.*

**3. Being defamed, we entreat.**

**1 Cor. 4:13**

**Defamed:** Blasphemed; spoken of and to, in harsh, abusive, and reproachful manner

**Entreat:** Conciliate; make earnest appeal; beg

**Filth:** Barnes: *It denotes filth, or that which is collected by sweeping a house, or that which is collected and cast away by purifying or cleansing anything; any vile worthless, and contemptible object; the rinsing of dirty pots and pans.*

**Offscouring:** the food particles wiped off dishes and pots by rubbing hard.

We are regarded as nothing but dust and \_\_\_\_\_!
